The new member knows very little about the church, we the members are expected, like they are a child in kindergarten to be their teachers.

The three fold purpose of the church is 1 – Do missionary work. 2 – Redeem the dead – by doing genealogy and going to the temple to be baptized for our dead ancestors, which is missionary work. 3 - Edifying the Saints, or other members of the church, so they too, go to the temples and get their ordinance work done. We do this by every position we hold in Jesus Christ's church. A primary teacher is edifying the children, etc.

Here is what one ward in is doing. They are providing the newly baptized member or family the opportunity to do all of those things, within the first 4 – to 6 weeks.

During the time they are taught, the friends become those who fellowship them during their teaching. They are told about the temple and Elijah coming back. They are told they will be taught how to obtain the spirit of Elijah, by doing genealogy for their ancestors and being baptized for them. The ward has the professional teachers, who have been doing it a long time.

The goal is to keep them active in the church. Let's get them up to speed as soon as we can.

1 – The ward missionary is involved with them. Teaching them.

2 - The professional - Genealogy teacher - Family History Consultant. Goes over to meet them, teaches the whole family how to do genealogy, and researches names in their family. The family, those over 12 are worthy to go to the temple, to be baptized for the dead. Now, the church statistics are that 90% of those who go to the temple within 4 to 6 weeks remain active in the church.

3 - So the new family is trained and now able to do: missionary work – for the dead through genealogy and going to the Temple. If 90% stay active they are ready to edify the saints and their nonmember friends.

Also, all in the family have had a job. Remember to include the whole family in the training. Even 7 and 8 years old will learn and it will be one of the things they remember their whole lives.

The program could be going on each month with 2 families in the ward, that have been members, but have not done genealogy nor gone to the temple.

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
